- 1. Who was Martin Buber, and why is he considered an existentialist? What does he argue in *I and Thou*, and do you find his ethical philosophy compelling? Why or why not? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 2. Who was Miguel de Unamuno, and why is he considered an existentialist? How does "San Manuel Bueno, Mártir" illustrate religious existentialism, and what do you make of it? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 3. Who was Jean-Paul Sartre, and why is he considered an existentialist? What existential themes does he explore in *Nausea*, and what do you make of his famous novel? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 4. Who was Albert Camus, and why is he considered an existentialist? What existential themes does he explore in *The Stranger*, and what do you make of his famous novel? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 5. Who was Simone Weil, and why is she considered an existentialist? What does she argue in "The Love of God and Affliction," and how does this text illustrate religious existentialism? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 6. Who was Simone de Beauvoir, and why is she considered an existentialist? What does she argue in *The Ethics of Ambiguity*, and what do you make of it? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 7. Who was Frantz Fanon, and why is he considered an existentialist? What does he argue in "The Lived Experience of the Black Man," and what do you make of his analysis of racism? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 8. Who was Keiji Nishitani, and why is he considered an existentialist? What does he say about existentialism and Buddhism, and what do you make of his analysis? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
- 9. Who is Lewis R. Gordon, and why is he considered an existentialist? What existential themes does he explore in his work, and what do you make of them? Use five additional sources in your discussion.
